As our Admissions Assistant, you will take an active operational role in supporting the work of London Park Schools' Admissions and Marketing Department, joining at an exciting time as we head towards the transition from Eaton Square Senior and Eaton Square Sixth to London Park School Mayfair and London Park Sixth in September 2024. More specifically, we need someone who can work within the broader Admissions team, stepping in when needed, but taking specific ownership and responsibility for Admissions to our Hybrid stream at LPS Mayfair and LPS Sixth, opening in September 2024

This newly created role presents an exciting opportunity for an someone with excellent administrative and communication skills to be part of the future vision of London Park Schools as we grow and develop our offering.

The Admissions Assistant will support the team with all aspects of recruitment, assessment and retention, delivering exemplary customer service and working closely with the Admissions Manager for LPS Mayfair and Sixth, the Hybrid team and the broader LPS Admissions and Marketing team.

An appreciation and understanding of independent education is important and previous work within an Admissions function would be desirable, but not essential. Knowledge and demonstrable skills in managing databases and admissions systems would be highly desirable, particularly Salesforce and iSAMs – although training is provided. Excellent written and verbal communication and a good knowledge of Microsoft 365 is important.

This is a role which would suit someone looking for a high degree of autonomy and flexibility as the role lends itself to working remotely with occasional time in school – e.g. for Open Events and to help out at particularly busy times.

Hybrid learning is an exciting option within an exciting group of schools. We do hope you would like to join us in helping to develop and grow this exciting offer.

About the Admissions Assistant Role

Working under the direction of the Admissions Manager and Head of Admissions and Marketing across all aspects of the LPS and Hybrid admissions process, the Admissions Assistant will be responsible for ensuring the smooth running and successful completion of the Hybrid admissions process, from initial enquiry through to students joining the school. This role is pivotal in ensuring that Hybrid @ LPS Mayfair and LPS Sixth grows and works within and alongside the community of day students to agreed targets whilst ensuring all families receive personal attention.

Main Areas of Responsibility

- To take primary responsibility for the administration and management of the Hybrid Admissions process, working closely with the Hybrid team.
- In doing this, to support the Head of Marketing & Admissions and Admissions Manager in delivering an efficient, professional and welcoming admissions service to all stakeholders.
- To deal professionally and efficiently with telephone, email and face-to-face enquiries to ensure that all applicants receive a positive impression of the school.
- To write accurate and appropriate emails and letters at all stages of the admissions process, ranging from individual responses to preparing mail-merged mail-outs.
- To help with the organisation of events such as Open Days and induction events
- To assist in processing applications in Salesforce and iSAMS in accordance with required procedures from initial application through to offer and acceptance.
- To assist in maintaining a comprehensive enquiries database/record including enquiries received via Eventbrite for Open Events
- To compile statistical information and student lists and information as required.

Hybrid @ London Park Schools

Hybrid is a natural extension of LPS's forward thinking stance and we are delighted to be the first school within the Dukes Education family to be offering this exciting concept.

Hybrid @ LPS Mayfair will offer four days teaching on-line with one day a week in school – centred around practical subjects such as sport, science, art and drama. A Sixth form option is available.

For many families, hybrid is a welcome change to the rigidity of school models. Hybrid attracts a wide range of families and past students have included budding sports stars with heavy training regimes, home schooled students migrating back towards



integration into a school community, and many students and families who simply prefer to learn this way.

The flexible curriculum and independent study sessions give students breathing space. The ethos is one of warmth, flexibility and care and there is an explicit focus on nurturing each student, ensuring they feel heard and known is at the heart of everything.

Expert teachers deliver remote lessons to a very high standard. Class sizes are deliberately small, and students receive a great deal of personalised feedback and attention. Students have the benefit of joining a full school community at least once a week, helping them get the best of both worlds, online and in person. Sports teams, shows, trips, clubs and all the aspects of school life that enrich are available.

LPS Mayfair offers a warm, inclusive, and stimulating learning environment for students aged 11-16 and a seamless transition to our Sixth Form, located in Belgravia, for students looking to continue their education to A Levels.
